2. VOI Standard - Steps

2.1 Verification of Identification Documents and Categories

Set out below are categories of documents that are required to be used for the VOI Standard.

- Starting with Category 1, obtain from the Subject <u>original</u> documents from one of the Categories in the following table. If you are reasonably satisfied Category 1 cannot be met, then move to Category 2 and so on.
- The documents produced must be <u>current</u>, except for an expired Australian Passport which has not been cancelled and was current within the preceding 2 years.
- Category 5 where the requirements of Categories 1 to 4 cannot be met, Category 5(a) may be used. Where Category 5(a) cannot be met, Category 5(b) may be used. Categories 6(a), and then 6(b), are for use for Persons who are not Australian citizens or residents.

You must retain a copy of all documents produced by the Subject, and Identity Declarant (if applicable). Consider how you will securely store this information and comply with Privacy Obligations. See the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner website.

2.2 Original Documents Sighted

- You must be reasonably satisfied the document is genuine.
- Where a document containing a photograph is produced by the Subject/Identity Declarant you must be satisfied that the Subject/Identity Declarant is a reasonable likeness (for example the shape of his or her mouth, nose, eyes and the position of his or her cheek bones) to the person depicted in the photograph.
- Where a document is produced containing a signature, check that the signature on the document is consistent with the Subject/Identity Declarant's signature below.
- Where a document is foreign, consider if you need a translation by an accredited translator.
